Collections Committee News

Great News! The Collections Committee voted at its March meeting to purchase a fine drop-leaf table, attributed to Samuel Sewall of York, one of colonial Maine's best-known cabinetmakers. While the Tates undoubtedly brought some of their English household with them when they emigrated to Maine, they also would have purchased local furniture as needed. This table, dating 1755-1770, is an exceptionally fine example of the work of local cabinetmakers in the District of Maine. Much of the production of the many cabinetmakers and joiners working in Falmouth in Casco Bay was destroyed in the 1775 naval bombardment. Looking to other major craftsmen is an important way to represent local production and Sewall is among the finest of colonial Maine's craftsmen.



This mahogany table matches in design and construction a maple example in Old York Historical Society's collection, according to Thomas Johnson, their former curator. Other related examples can be found at the Sayward-Wheeler House, a property of Historic New England, also in York. We were able to acquire this great object at a most reasonable price and are thrilled to have it in the collection.

Dedicated funds from the NSCDA have helped purchase this table but the committee is actively seeking funds to demonstrate the importance of building our eighteenth-century collection. The Robinson family has graciously agreed to have contributions made in memory of Elizabeth M. Robinson support this purchase. Other members of the committee have also offered to help secure this wonderful object for the Museum. The committee is also working on an acquisitions plan for the museum where it hopes to identify new financial support for purchases. The Committee is also working to ready the kitchen hearth for the installation of the clock jack and andirons with spit hooks for the summer season. 
We also will have openings for greeters in the gift shop. The Colonial Dames are in the process of scheduling the position of greeter, but we can always use more volunteers!
